

# Sports School Gives Back

*Project Champions Way*

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Singapore Sports School showed their heart for the community when they raised over \$55 000 for Singapore Disability Sports Council and Special Olympics Singapore as part of Project Champions Way.

In fact, their efforts went beyond fundraising as staff and student-athletes partnered Singapore Disability Sports Council and Siglap South Community Club Youth Executive Committee to co-host the ASEAN Para Games qualifying competitions and the Adapted Sports Adventure Day.

The day's events saw over 300 guests visit Sports School on 20 May where they participated in 11 challenge sports stations as part of the inaugural Adapted Sports Adventure Day which aimed to educate the able-bodied community on how sports can be made accessible to persons with different functionalities whilst introducing adapted sports to persons with disability.

Among the visitors was Guest of Honour Ms Sim Ann, Senior Minister of State for the Ministries of Culture, Community and Youth and Trade and Industry, who was on hand to lend her support to the para athletes participating in the selection trials for the Kuala Lumpur 2017 ASEAN Para Games.

Project Champions Way is Sports School's annual Corporate Social Responsibility Programme and school-wide Value in Action activity which seeks to encourage our student-athletes to recognise the needs of the community and to champion worthy causes in helping the less fortunate.

This is the third year Sports School has partnered Singapore Disability Sports Council as part of its Project Champions Way efforts, with our staff and student-athletes raising in excess of the \$50 000 target each year.

Once again, our student-athletes have showed that the Champions Way is not just the name of the road, but the way that Champions for Others are made.
